

## Eligibility Requirements

Criteria	Description	Guidance
Primary Disability	Students must have an Intellectual and/or developmental disability (I/DD) that significantly interferes with academic performance, social development, independent living skills and/or adaptive living skills. Age	Students must be between 18 and 26 years old when applying for ASTEP.	
IDEA Eligible	Students must be <i>currently</i> or <i>formerly</i> eligible for <b>special education</b> under <b>IDEA</b> .	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)
	Students may have an unsigned diploma (social graduate) or have a signed diploma (high school graduate) to attend ASTEP.	If a student attends ASTEP and is still enrolled in high school or dually enrolled, ASTEP will coordinate with the student's IEP team to develop and implement the student's person-centered plan.
ACT or SAT Testing	Taking the <b>ACT or SAT test</b> is recommended but not required. No	Contact your high school in the fall of the students junior year, if
Recommended	minimum score is required. Students interested in taking college courses for credit will need to have completed the ACT or SAT test regardless or score, prior to enrollment in ASTEP.	possible, to discuss taking the ACT or SAT test and consider possible testing accommodations that may be available. Adaptive Skills	Students must be able to do the following activities independently or with minimal support from an outside agency:  • Manage health-related issues  • Take required medications  • Manage specialized dietary or allergy needs  • Manage personal care needs and maintain healthy hygiene  • Demonstrate safety skills in unsupervised settings	Students may qualify for Developmental Disability (DD) Services to assist with these criteria. ASTEP does not provide 24/7 supervision or supports.

Literacy Skills	Students must have the ability to <b>read and write at a basic level</b> with or without adaptations.	
Outside Services	Prior to enrollment, students will be referred to North Dakota <b>Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)</b> services if they are not current VR clients.	ND Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Regional Offices
ASTEP Expectations	<ul> <li>Students must:</li> <li>Be accepting of supports from program staff, mentors, faculty and other university professionals,</li> <li>Agree to participate in all courses, sessions, internships and employment training; and</li> <li>Demonstrate the desire to attend college and be enrolled in the ASTEP program at Minot State University.</li> </ul>	

## Please note:

• At this time it is not required that ASTEP students be eligible for <u>Developmental Disabilities</u> (<u>DD</u>) <u>services</u>; however, prior to determining a student's program eligibility, verification of eligibility for DD services may be requested if additional supports are determined necessary. This information will be considered when deciding if a student can be supported appropriately while enrolled in the ASTEP program.

## How is program eligibility determined?

- Review of the student's most recent IEP and relevant assessments,
- Face to face interview with the student and parent(s)/guardian,
- Review of three letters of recommendations for the student from non-family members; and
- Consultation with the student's IEP team, Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, Developmental Disabilities Program Manager or other service agencies.
