**Kari Chiasson** is an assistant professor in the special education program at the University of North Dakota (UND), Department of Teaching and Learning. She coordinates the teacher preparation programs for the Master's of special education degrees in the areas of Early Childhood Special education and Visual Impairment. She also co-teaches a course on Autism: Intensive Early Intervention through the distance Autism Certificate Program at UND. Prior to teaching at the University of North Dakota, Kari worked for over 20 years in the field of early childhood special education/visual impairment. She worked at North Dakota Vision Services/School for the Blind as the Parent-Infant Program Coordinator, Preschool Special Needs Teacher for Grand Forks Public Schools, and as a consultant for numerous preschool and Head Start programs in the state. She has presented regionally, nationally and internationally on topics such as vision screening, inclusion practices in preschool, and preparing pre-service teachers to meet the needs of students with disabilities in their classrooms.

**Carol Johnson** specializes in early intervention. She is currently the director of the Right Track Program for Region IV in North Dakota and director for the Statewide Technical Assistance Program for early intervention. She is an adjunct professor at the University of North Dakota teaching a graduate class on Intensive Early Intervention for young children with ASD. She has over 20 years experience supporting young children with disabilities and their families.

**Abstract:** There is agreement that early identification and intensive programming supports improved outcomes for young children with ASD. However, there is a lack of consensus on how to choose an intervention for these children. It is important for practitioners and families to understand the nature of autism as well as the range of “best practices” when making important intervention decisions. This presentation will address the National Research Council’s guidelines for effective programs within a continuum of “contexts for learning” to consider including: methods, priorities, intervention supports, teaching variables and strategies.

**Who Should Attend?** This session is appropriate for parents, childcare professionals, Head Start Teachers, early childhood teachers, early interventionists, Right Track personnel, nurses, physicians, early childhood special educators and other medical personnel.
